The Gardener's Corner

May - Plant Your Summer Vegetables As soon as the last frost has passed, fill out your vegetable garden with plants that like warm weather, including beans, cucumbers, melons, peppers, squash, tomatoes.

Fix Blossom - End Rot

This is a common problem with tomatoes, peppers, squash, and eggplant that appears as a blackish, rotten spot on the end of the fruit opposite the stem. It results when soggy or overly acid soil prevents the plant's root from absorbing enough calcium to build cell walls. To prevent it, apply a half-cup of lime around the base of the plant and water it in. Then mulch around the base to help excess water drain.

Set Out Colorful Annuals

Adopt all the bedding plants you can get your hands on, and use them to fill beds, pots, baskets, and window boxes. Just about any annual you can name is ready to plant now, including the big five-geraniums, impatiens, marigolds, petunias, and

tive- geraniums, impatiens, marigolds, petunias, and zinnias.

Create Container Bouquets

As you set out bedding plants, plan ahead to have a few orphans to plant together in container bouquets. Fill large containers with potting soil then plug in your starters. Place those with upright growing habit in the center, and tuck sprawling or cascading plants inside the rims of the pots. The SLC is so fortunate that Aidan and Ashley Russell have joined us in love and fellowship.

Aidan and Ashley have always been interested in not only growing their own food but also in giving back to the earth. Fresh produce has increased in interest and popularity in the last decade. So, Aidan and Ashley decided to obtain a farm where they could help provide for the needs and desires of the community.

Aidan says that their farm, "The Cnome Holler Farm, practices regenerative organic farming. The short explanation is that we practice rebuilding the soil and protect the soil microbiome. All our produce is grown using proven organic methods and procedures. Although not registered as organic, we still practice organic farming. We currently have our plans and infrastructure for our market gardens, free-range egg laying chickens, dairy goats, and honeybees."

In the future, Aidan and Ashley, hope to reach out to local restaurants to provide farm to table fresh and locally grown produce. They also intend to provide market products at local farmer's meets and provide CSA to members that join our program.

The couple was drawn to the Franklin area in May 2021 when they visited several states for a week to view properties. Aidan and Ashley felt each property had something missing, but they couldn't identify what that was. Then, as they rounded the corner of 441, they both knew this was the one they had been waiting for; it immediately felt like home. And then everything fell into place. They've now been in Franklin for over a year—and are happy and content with their choice.

They absolutely know this is where they are supposed to be and that their good work will not only provide for them now but also after they are gone—a legacy for all those who will come after them. They walk their property at least three times a day, rejoicing in all the beauty surrounding them.

The couple sees their biggest challenge as wanting to provide more than they have produced. However, they will continue to allow the universe to unfold before them with honor, respect and their deepest gratitude.

Aidan and Ashley found the Spiritual Light Center via a flier and continue to be excited about that the SLC offers a lot of what they have practiced and attended in Gainesville, FL. They envision the SLC continuing the growth they experienced as a result of their long-term affiliation with Unity of Gainesville, as well as their years of devotion to Mickie Singer at the temple of the Universe.
