Things to do in September
BULBS

Plant spring flowering bulbs. Before you order or buy any bulb make sure you consider the following.

- 1. The color of the flower
- 2. The months they will bloom
- 3. How tall they will get
- 4. How deep to plant them
 SET OUT PANSIES

As soon as you see pansies at garden centers, take some home and plant them, so they will have time to develop reliable roots before the soil gets cold. Fall planted pansies often survive winter. Also I have had success with snapdragons.

Now is the time to divide perennials and clumps of multiplying bulbs like daffodils. But September afternoons can still get hot and that's not good for uprooted plants. Try to do your digging and dividing on cool, overcast days.
