### **President's Message**

This month's member spotlight is on Jeannine Johnson, our very own in-house Reiki master and meditation person. In talking with Jeannine, I gained a lot of insight into her journey which I am excited to share with all of you. So, sit back, get comfortable and learn a little more about our SLC fellow family member Jeannine!

Rev. Jeannine Johnson was born in Tulsa, Oklahoma and received her bachelor's degree in business administration from Oklahoma State University in Stillwater. The 1980 movie "Resurrection" about a woman who heals people inspired Jeannine a great deal. In the end of the movie, the woman heals a child by hugging him. Jeannine prayed right then, "Lord, if it is possible for me to heal people, please make it possible." Shortly thereafter in the late '80s, Jeannine began her Spiritual journey in St. Petersburg FL, attending spiritual churches, spiritual book study classes, other studies and classes on opening up her intuition, psychometry, using a pendulum, and various workshops.

In mid-1992, Jeannine was one of eight attending a group Reiki session at a Spiritual conference. Afterwards, the Reiki Master told Jeannine, "I am guided to tell you that you need to learn Reiki. I live in Miami, so find someone here in St. Petersburg to teach you." Jeannine was very open to the idea already, but Reiki Masters were few and far between, and the cost back then was the same price Jeannine charges today. Knowing this is what she wanted to do to further her spiritual

journey, Jeannine took some time to save the money and to find a teacher, which finally happened in 1997. That same year, she achieved her goal of becoming a Reiki Master. Also in 1997, Jeannine became certified in hypnosis at the Omni Hypnosis school in Deland, FL where she learned to do past life regressions.

Her first regression was with her sister Teresa. Jeanine shared with me that Teresa did NOT believe in past lives but said "let's try it and see what happens." First Jeannine took her back to her 5th birthday party. Teresa said she saw a giant red teddy bear and was then guided to the first time she was able to walk without assistance as a toddler. Teresa said, "Mom's teeth look different and she is wearing a white blouse with a pretty collar." Teresa and Jeannine's Mom later confirmed the teddy bear did in fact exist and produced a picture of the teddy bear. She also shared "Yes my teeth were different as that was before my partial." Next Jeannine took Teresa to another time, another place and another person. Teresa said "I am a man on a black horse, and I am a leader in front of an army of men on horses. She was pacing back and forth on the horse waiting for battle. Teresa later

asked, "I could not have been a man, could I?" Jeannine replied "yes, we can be different genders and we play many different roles in many other lifetimes." Teresa now believes in the possibility of past lives.

Jeannine herself has had many spontaneous past life visions and recollections. One particular lifetime that stands out for her is a young 22-year-old woman, a poet at a tuberculosis center. She is heartbroken because she was engaged and can only see the man through a window and knows she will never marry him and will die soon. Later, Jeannine Googled the woman and discovered she was a listed poet and was known to have invented a particular rhyming stanza that is still being used today. Her exact name and details of that lifetime are in one of Jeannine's journals.

Jeannine was attuned to Reiki 1 and Reiki 2 and was guided to take her Reiki publicly in 2006. She currently teaches and practices Reiki at the Mountain Valley Health Food store at 150 Georgia Road, here in Franklin. 
